Chairman's Rant

I suppose I should rant about the horrors of the lockdown. Firstly the effect on our club activities. As you will have seen from the club website and the magazine, everything is cancelled through to August. Forecasting ahead of that is tricky. The restrictions have been

changed at short notice, speculation in the media is rife. It does seem that the Government react to pressure, and the publicised views of the scientists are varied. It would seem reasonable to expect that the social distancing will continue for some time, but may be reduced to 1.5 or even 1 metre. Pubs with open gardens may be allowed to open before indoor facilities. As far as I am able to judge, the Bridge Hotel [which does not have a telephone response] has very limited garden space, but we might be able to meet in the overflow car park at some time. The Collingham Squash club is closed, it has virtually no outdoor catering area and it would seem unlikely that our BBQ will be able to go ahead in September. Could it work anyway with social distancing?

We might be able to have a run out, meeting in a car park, stopping for a picnic without close socialising. Any thoughts on that please? Those of us who are 'shielding' seem unlikely to be able to participate even in such limited activity. We do not know how many members are actually in 'shielding', we are, plus one other member we know of. Perhaps others who are shielding could let me know so that we can plan accordingly. As things stand, it seems we are unlikely to get much classic car activity this year.

Secondly the effects on us at home. Really, for us, it has not been so bad. Right at the start I was told that I was in the extremely vulnerable category, and I should quarantine totally for at least 12 weeks. June decided it was easier for her to join me, as she does not drive, is not used to public transport, and if she went out we would have to live completely separately at home. FBHVC Survey

The Federation of British Historic Vehicle Clubs have published survey results on the effects of Covid 19 on classic car clubs. Here are some of the highlights:-

1. 68% of clubs have cancelled their annual rally
2. 10,000 club events have been cancelled
3. 53% of clubs report an effect on their finances [WCCC is sound]
4. 40% of clubs have seen a reduction in membership
5. 61% of clubs still hope to hold events this year
6. 50% of clubs are planning to hold cancelled events next year
