David Addyman and Bob were judging the classic vehicles, They were a bit surprised to find 4 bicycles and 8 motor bikes amongst the vehicles to be judged, not to mention an armoured weapon carrier with a machine gun [immediately awarded best in show as the gun aimed at us]. Only two WCCC Members cars were exhibited, Gerald and Pam's Humber and Melvyn's Austin van.



Judging was tricky, there was close competition for best in show between a Rolls Royce Silver Spur, a delivery bicycle and Melvyn's little van. Eventually the van came out top. Melvyn went on next weekend to exhibit at the Whitby regatta, where he was presented with a special prize as he had won a prize at every show for 50 years.

August Club meeting Our own member Ged Lavin amused us for an hour with his recollections of events whilst he was engaged in property developments in a variety of countries. A very well received presentation as no members conducted separate conversations during Ged's spiel. We then had an extended discussion on the venue for club meetings and the associated costs. In a series of votes it was decided the club should move to Grange Park and club membership fees should be increased to £30 per annum to help cover the additional costs.

Summer frolics run to a picnic. David and Anthea arranged excellent weather for a delightful drive to Studley Royal. This was our last departure from the Bridge Hotel. The picnic venue in the car park at Studley Royal gave us a private area just for the 10 WCCC cars, and the handy positioning of a Yorkshire Dales ice cream vendor meant we could enjoy an ice cream to finish.





Burley in Wharfedale summer festival What a lovely classic car show. We were amazed to see the cars parking on the actual cricket pitch. Aside from the cars on display, the village festival included a number of charity stalls, several 'street food' stalls including a



crepe stand. In the village hall there was a craft and antiques market, and the village pub served a good selection of food. All in all a very enjoyable day out.



Wetherby Classic Car Club Barbecue, was relocated to Wetherby Grange as the facility at Collingham and Linton Sports Association was not available. After a bit of a glitch when the gas cylinder had to be replaced, the BBQ got under way. An excellent buffet provided by Joan, Gillian and Margaret was nicely laid out. The BBQ put on a major show of conflagration when it was first lit due to not having been cleaned of fat by the previous user. The rest of the day went well, and 24 members enjoyed our first use of the Grange Park facility.



Otley Extravaganza, Our usual club stand at the bottom of the field was occupied by 9 cars. The show was fully up to numbers, with a substantial variety of vehicles as usual. The Middlemiss pork pies were really good and enjoyed by most our members. The show appealed for helpers to marshal



the car parks, and David and Anthea parked 150 visitors cars in 45 minutes. It must have been the best crowd for many years. The weather was on our side and all members stayed to the end.



September meeting Our first regular club meeting at Grange Park enjoyed a very well researched presentation on Yorkshires Vanishing Coastline by Malcolm Brooke. The technical detail kept members enthralled, and the basic conclusion was that the coastline will be eroded, and nature will have it's way. Probably Spurn Point will cease to exist by 2050. Overall the new venue worked well, there was a bit of noise

intrusion from the main bar which may be improved if the screen door can be properly closed.

Knavesmire YHVG classic car show - Another big local show. The Knavesmire was well populated with all types of vehicles, there seemed to be more buses than usual this year. Joan feels she must mention the bacon butties, best of the season, big, 4 rashers and choose from mushrooms or tomato's. Great value. The weather was a bit cold, and the wise members brought themselves a flask of hot soup, a lesson learned for the rest of us.





Fish and chips run - 8 members drove to Leeds Bradford airport to partake of fish and chips at Murgatroyds. We have driven past it many times, but never stopped there. The service was very good, the fish and chips first class, and the price of £14 for a 3 course meal with tea for pensioners was exceptional value.

Retro Torque show at Stockeld Park This was a new show for us, free entry and almost 200 cars on show. Retro Torque is an internet based classic enthusiast group. They started a few years ago with meetings of 3 or 4 people at the Harewood Arms. Now they have grown to a group of 800 members, and they regularly have monthly Saturday lunch meetings at the Punchbowl Inn, Marton Cum Grafton. These meetings have become so



popular the pub car park cannot accommodate other customers during their meeting. WCCC had 8

cars on display, but 3 were parked amongst the main display. Once again the weather was cold, and most members left by about 2.30 for the warmth of home.

Chairmans Rant

We have noticed that the numbers of members joining our events such as shows and runs is well short of the number of club members. Also, as we do not have a speaker finder, organising club meetings is a bit tricky. Attached to this magazine is a form asking all our members to suggest activities which they would like to attend. At the working group meeting held to discuss our venue change, Colin suggested that we should endeavour to increase our membership as part of the plan to ensure the club remains viable for the future. He suggested that we modify the club name to include vehicles other than cars, e.g. "Wetherby Classic Vehicle Club". This would encourage people with interests in motor bikes [we do have a new motor cycling member Paul Brown], and possibly commercial vehicles etc. Potentially this will be a proposition at the AGM. We also discussed publicity for the club, we will find out how much use is made of the existing web site, and endeavour to promote it in search engines.

It was also suggested that we might take advantage of social media, but none of the working group members have much experience of Facebook, Twitter etc. If any member who is familiar with social media would like to help, please contact Bob or Colin. I did put a note on the Wetherby Grapevine page on Facebook with details of our move to Grange Park, and 2 potential new members came forward but neither has actually signed up yet.
